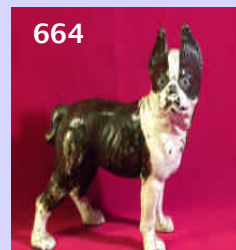
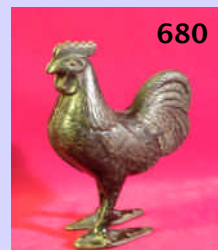
**Primitives & Folk-Art
